Vaccine pop-up clinic in Gary

Calumet New Tech High School, 3900 Calhoun St., Gary, is hosting a drive-through vaccination clinic **8 a.m. to 6 p.m. CDT March 20**, and **8 a.m. to 4 p.m. CDT March 21**. **Eligible** Hoosiers need to make an appointment at [OurShot.IN.gov](https://ourshot.in.gov). Find the site on the map, click to register and then search for the ZIP code 46408 to pull up this clinic or call 211.



(You must be an Indiana resident and show proof of age. That can be a photo ID or other document, such as a utility bill, bank statement, lease agreement or record from your doctor with your address and date of birth.)

New high-risk groups eligible

The Indiana Department of Health has expanded the list of individuals with high-risk conditions who are now eligible for vaccination. Hoosiers can review the [complete eligibility list](#). These patients are identified by their physicians and will receive notification via text or email with a unique registration link. (Patients should contact their provider if they have not received notice of eligibility.)

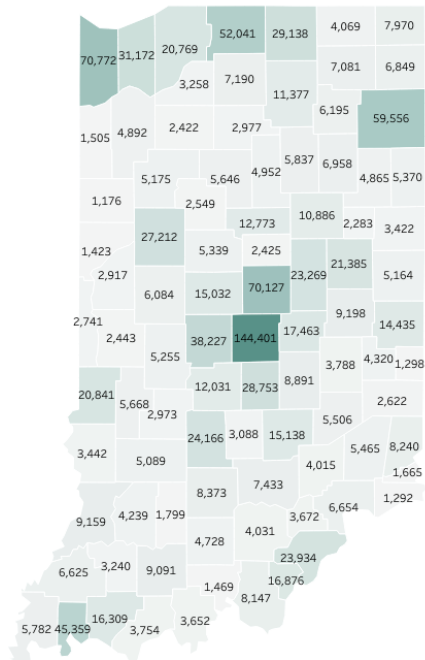

Total first doses



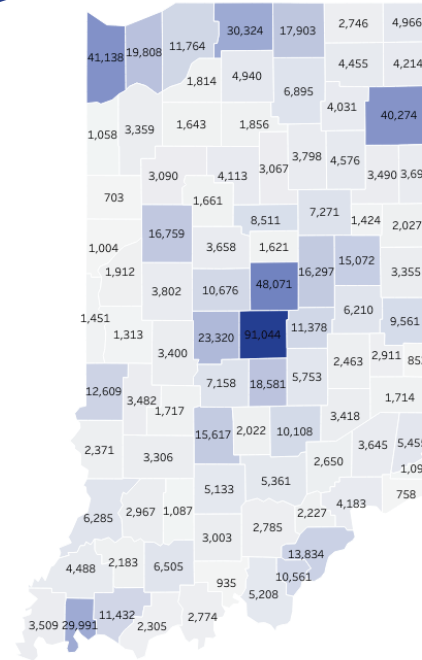
Total individuals Fully Vaccinated

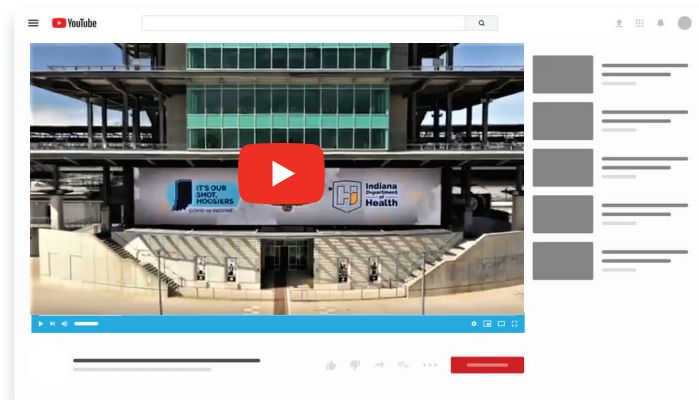
- 72% of Hoosiers 80+
