Kids 12 and older, it's your shot!

The CDC's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) met Wednesday and recommended the use of the Pfizer vaccine for anyone age 12 and older. Pfizer applied for Emergency Use Authorization from the U.S. FDA for the 12- to 15-year-old age group after a clinical trial of around 2,000 children showed the vaccine was 100 percent effective. PFIZER AT MOBILE CLINICS, HEALTH DEPARTMENTS

Because Pfizer is the only vaccine approved for kids as young as age 12, the Indiana Department of Health has distributed doses of the vaccine to all local health departments and mobile clinics to make sure it's easily available. You can find mobile and local health department clinic locations at [OurShot.IN.gov](https://ourshot.in.gov). All sites are labeled to indicate which vaccine they offer.

For your convenience, walk-up appointments are offered at most vaccination sites, but you can save some time by making an appointment and registering in advance. Mobile sites now open:

- **Learn about V-Safe**, the after-vaccination health checker, and the new **V-safe COVID-19 Pregnancy Registry.** V-safe is also available now in **multiple languages.**
- **Indiana Area Agencies on Aging** and AARP offices are assisting seniors making their vaccine appointments.
- Report any adverse effects from any vaccine to the **Vaccine Adverse Effect Reporting System (VAERS).**

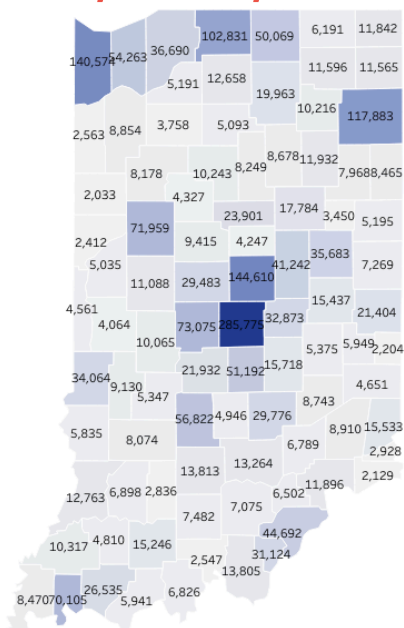

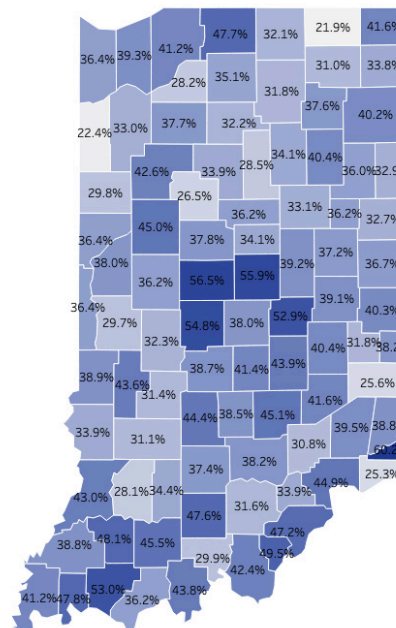
Total Individuals Fully Vaccinated*

Here are the latest percentages of people who received a vaccine by age group. These percentages include residents and staff in long-term care facilities.

74.6% of 80+	62.4% of 60 - 64	38.1% of 40 - 44	27.7% of 20 - 24
76.5% of 75 - 79	49.4% of 55 - 59	33.3% of 35 - 39	23.7% of 16 - 19
