Pfizer vaccine is available to anyone age 12 and older. Walk-up appointments are offered at most vaccination sites, but you can save time by making an appointment in advance. Visit OurShot.IN.gov and search by clinic's name or city.

Extended hours at pharmacies

Select pharmacies across Indiana are staying open late every Friday in June to offer more flexible appointment availability for the COVID-19 vaccine. These extended hours will ensure that everyone can get vaccinated at times convenient to them. (Not all pharmacies are participating, so check with your specific location.)

- UPDATED: What you can do if you are fully vaccinated.
- Proof of vaccination is available at Access Indiana. Scroll down to the "Indiana Vaccination Portal" tile, create an account, and download a vaccination certificate.
- Register for a vaccination appointment at OurShot.IN.gov (Chrome or Firefox). Call Indiana 211 or (1-866-211-9966) if you have difficulty registering online. Most vaccine clinics now take walk-ins.
- Learn about V-Safe, the after-vaccination health checker, and the new V-safe COVID-19 Pregnancy Registry. V-safe is also available now in multiple languages.
- Indiana Area Agencies on Aging and AARP offices are assisting seniors making their vaccine appointments.
- Report any adverse effects from any vaccine to the Vaccine Adverse Effect Reporting System (VAERS).






Total Individuals Fully Vaccinated*



Don't delay!

You can now receive your COVID-19 vaccine with other immunizations.

The CDC updated its guidance on the <u>co-administration of the COVID-19 vaccine</u>. It was initially recommended that the COVID-19 vaccine be given alone until more was known about how the COVID-19 vaccine was affected by other immunizations. Enough data have now been collected to determine that the COVID-19 vaccine can safely be given without regard to the timing of other vaccines. Take advantage of this opportunity to get protected against COVID-19, and make sure your other immunizations are also up to date.

Find proof of vaccination at Access Indiana

Visit the Indiana Department of Health Vaccination Portal, found on the <u>Access Indiana page</u>, to print a vaccination certificate. If you don't have an Access Indiana account, you can create one <u>HERE</u>.
